

Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice & Criminology at the University of North Carolina, Charlotte.

The Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology invites applications for an Assistant Professor position beginning August 15, 2024.

Required qualifications. Requirements for the position include: (1) a Ph.D. in Criminal Justice, Criminology, or a related discipline at the time of appointment, and (2) a commitment to high-quality teaching and mentoring of a diverse student population at the undergraduate and/or graduate levels. We are seeking candidates whose research and teaching focus on quantitative/qualitative research methods, data/crime analytics, and/or technology (e.g., data visualization, geographic information systems, crime analysis). Strong candidates will have a methodological skill set that will broaden the department's existing strengths, either quantitatively or qualitatively. Finalists will be asked to discuss how their teaching practices engage students of different ages, races, ethnicities, backgrounds, identities, and abilities, helping to remove barriers in order to ensure the success of all students regardless of their entry pathway into the university.

The Department. The Department consists of fourteen tenure-track faculty members and four full-time lecturers. B.A. and M.S. degrees are offered in Criminal Justice & Criminology and the Department contributes to the Interdisciplinary Ph.D. Program in Public Policy and the School of Data Science. The department will also partner with a proposed Ph.D. program in Data Science where Crime Analytics will be a domain of concentration.
